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International Institute of Space Law – Notes to the Annual Accounts (Dutch Civil Code, Book 2, Title 9) for the fiscal years ended 31 July 2019, 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023

A. Basis for the Presentation

- 1. <u>The Institute</u> The accompanying Annual Accounts present the financial position and result of the operations of the International Institute of Space Law ("IISL"), a Dutch association ("Vereniging") registered in Leiden, The Netherlands. IISL is a non-profit association which has the following purposes: (a) promotion of further development of space law and expansion of the rule of law in the exploration and use of outer space for peaceful purposes; (b) fostering of development of professional standards and professional ethics in the field of space law; (c) holding of meetings, colloquia and competitions on juridical and social science aspects of space activities, thereby providing fora for individuals from different legal systems and regions of the world to engage in the free expression and exchange of ideas relevant to space law and space policy; (d) preparation or commissioning of studies and reports; (e) publication of books, proceedings, reports and position papers; (f) granting and presentation of awards and certificates; (g) cooperation with appropriate international organizations and national institutions in the field of space law; and (h) conducting such other activities as may be considered desirable in fostering the development of space law and studies of legal and social science aspects of the exploration and use of outer space for peaceful purposes.
- 2. <u>Accounting Policies</u> The Annual Accounts are prepared in accordance with Title 9, Book 2, of the Dutch Civil Code and are intended to provide members the ability to make an informed assessment about the solvency and liquidity of the IISL.

B. Notes to the Balance Sheet

- 3. <u>Assets</u> Minor corrections have been made to figures in previous fiscal years.
- 4. <u>Opening Balance Equity</u> Strictly speaking, the members of the Institute do not have equity. This amount is the total cash balance when the present accounting system was started. The amount shown as the Opening Balance Equity will not change from year to year.
- 5. <u>Unrestricted Net Assets</u> This entry shows the Institutes total retained earnings from 2011.08.01 to present.

C. Notes to the Income Statement

- 6. <u>Income</u> Minor corrections also have been made in the columns for previous fiscal years.
- 7. <u>Interest</u> Interest income may increase with inflation.
- 8. <u>Royalties</u> Royalties fluctuate from year to year.
- 9. <u>Expenses</u> Minor corrections have been made in prior years.
- 10. <u>Bad Debt Write-Off</u> This account shows debts in the form of amounts payable for memberships that are writtenoff as expenses (with an off-setting entry in accounts receivable) when an individual's or institution's membership is terminated or when an amount due is discounted.
- 11. <u>Operations</u> The Institute moved the hosting of the accounting software to a cloud host to enable batch invoicing and to enable access to the accounting software by an assistant treasurer. In addition, the accounts are backed up on the cloud to ensure continuity of operations. Also included in the operational expenses are the expenses of filing and maintain copyrights in multiple jurisdictions.
